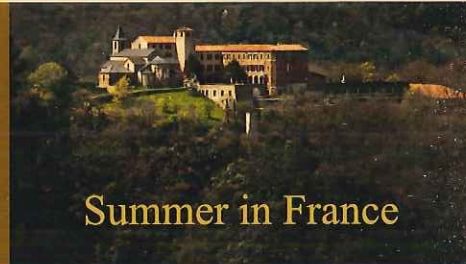

Summer in France

During this 10-day program, your home will be an 11th century monastery in Ambialet, France where Saint Francis University operates its study abroad program. From nearby castles to quaint medieval hilltop villages, this setting is the perfect place to live and breathe history. You'll also immerse yourself in the modern French culture where you can experience intellectual, linguistic, personal and spiritual growth, not to mention sample the local cuisine! This trip is part of the Professors in Residence course, **FNAR 102 Fine Arts: Culture and Values**.

Professors in Residence

The following college-level courses are offered to Bishop Guilfoyle students during the academic year.

◆ **BUS 101 Wall Street 101: Business in a Global Society** (3 college credits)

Provides a broad business perspective that considers the ancient and modern economic systems that balance resource supply with human wants, the ethical and legal dimensions of business decisions, the role of demographic diversity in a multicultural workforce, and how business operates in a global society.

Location: Taught by SFU faculty with regular classes onsite at BG, along with electronic communications. This is a Dual Enrollment course.

Prerequisite: Cumulative GPA of B+ or higher. Must be in 11th or 12th grade.

◆ **FNAR 102 Fine Arts: Culture and Values** (3 college credits)

This course aims to make clearer the policies of the Roman Catholic Church across Western Europe — and especially France — during the Middle Ages. In an introductory class on pre-historical times and Antiquity, we will examine the birth of spirituality and abstract thought in mankind, and then move along to the emergence and development of Christianity during the Roman Empire.

Location: Study abroad course with two prior-sessions and two post-sessions at BG with two weeks in Ambialet, France (see left panel).

Prerequisite: Additional application for acceptance to the program is required. Fees and expenses apply. Must be in 11th or 12th grade.

◆ **STAT 101 Statistics** (3 college credits)

Methods used in the collection, presentation, analysis and interpretation of data, including experimental design sampling theory, estimation theory, hypothesis testing, regression, correlation, analysis of variance and nonparametric techniques. The course is designed as an alternative to the traditional mathematics sequence leading to calculus. Computer analysis is also required.

Location: Taught by SFU faculty with regular classes onsite at BG, along with electronic communications. This is a Dual Enrollment course.

Prerequisite: 80% or higher in Algebra II, along with a recommendation from mathematics teacher. Must be in 11th or 12th grade.

◆ **EDUC 205 Introduction to Exceptionalities** (3 college credits)

The course will introduce students to the diversity of children and adolescents in regard to cognitive, behavioral and emotional differences, as well as differences in language and culture. This introductory course relates strongly to careers in education, psychology, social work, occupational therapy, physical therapy, etc. The 14 categories of exceptionality covered by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) will be closely examined. Understanding and programming for the needs of students with disabilities, students who are gifted and those who are English language learners will be addressed through explicit instruction, group activities, and authentic assessments.

Location: Taught by SFU faculty with regular classes onsite at BG, along with electronic communications. This is a Dual Enrollment course.

Prerequisite: Cumulative GPA of B+ or higher. Must be in 11th or 12th grade.

Saint Francis University Articulation Agreement

As a result of Bishop Guilfoyle's commitment to quality Catholic education, Saint Francis University recognizes Bishop Guilfoyle graduates by providing:

- ◆ guaranteed admission to Saint Francis University
- ◆ institutional financial aid (up to \$16,000 per year)
- ◆ advanced progression toward degree completion (*See details below.*)

Guaranteed admission into Saint Francis University requires graduates to meet certain requirements. Admission is guaranteed into programs other than those designated and controlled by the Office of Admissions as Competitive Admission Programs.

Students who successfully meet the guaranteed admission requirements are further assured to receive a minimum Saint Francis University institutional financial aid award of \$28,000 (\$7,000 for four undergraduate years). Students with exceptional qualifying credentials will be eligible for the Presidential Award (3.5 GPA, 1100 SAT, 24 ACT) valued up to \$40,000 (up to \$10,000 each year for four undergraduate years) or the Founders Award (3.8 GPA, 1250 SAT, 28 ACT) valued up to \$64,000 (up to \$16,000 per year all four undergraduate years). Students may only receive one merit-based institutional financial aid award. Additional financial assistance may be available to students. Students must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid no later than March 1 to receive full consideration of all Saint Francis University institutional financial aid awards.

Additionally, Bishop Guilfoyle students may receive college credits and advanced academic standing for all courses successfully completed throughout high school. Students must submit official transcripts of the courses completed in order to seek credit with Saint Francis University.
