Assignment 1:

- For this read, you will be analyzing one of the characters (choose one that you can write a full, single-spaced page on).
 - Requirements for your Character Analysis:
 - 3-4 Direct quotes with page numbers
 - At least 1 full, single-spaced page or 500 words
- This assignment is different than the previous year, but I feel it is more beneficial to the work we will be doing the coming year

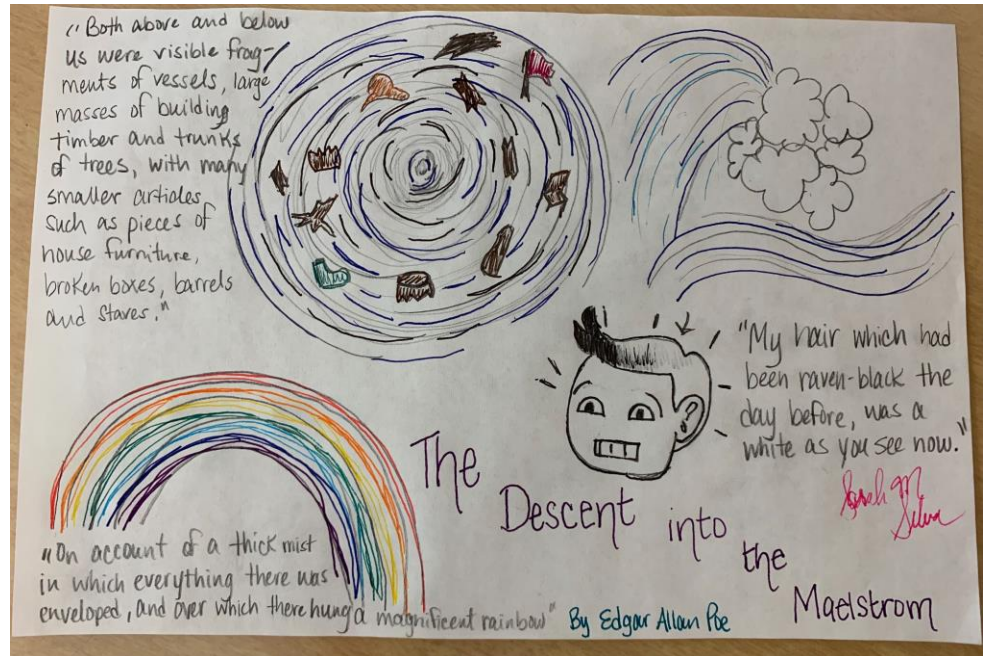
Assignment 2:

- You will choose between these 2 books for the other required read:
 - Heart of Darkness by Joseph Conrad***---can be a touch more difficult
 - All Quiet on the Western Front by Erich Maria Remarque*** ---longer and about the war
- For your second assignment, you will be creating a one-pager*(this will be shown below)
 - Requirements for the one pager:
 - 3 of the most important quotes (your opinion) from the book
 - 1 illustration per quote (3 in total)

Example of One-Pager

- ❑ This is from the Edgar Allan Poe short story, A Descent into the Maelstrom, drawn by me!

- ❑ A one-pager you are required to pull 3 important quotes from the story and illustrate them to the best of your ability. You should aim to fill the whole page, like shown above. You do not have to be an amazing artist, but you will need to do your best work.



- ❑ Just try to avoid stick figures as they can be hard to show emotion without having to make them too big
